- 1) Go to the [Bookshare Summer Reading page](https://www.bookshare.org/cms/campaign/summer) (www.bookshare.org/cms/campaign/summer), log in to Bookshare, and select one of the Reading Lists that Bookshare has created for its members.

Step 2: Your Students Can Start their Summer Reading!

- 1) Ask your students to log in to www.Bookshare.org with their own user names and passwords.
- 2) They will see the newly-assigned Reading List on their My Bookshare page or from their own My Reading Lists page

Questions?

Q: When would I copy the Reading List rather than subscribe to it?

A: If you want to make changes to a Reading List, such as removing books or adding books, you can copy the list, rename it, and make these changes. Copying a list takes a “snapshot” of it at that point in time. Bookshare may continue to add books to their public Reading List, but these will not be added to your copy of the list. For this reason, in some cases, you may prefer to BOTH subscribe to Bookshare’s list and also make a copy of it that you can edit.

Q: Some of my students have individual memberships. Can I assign them Reading Lists too?

A: Yes! And if you want to be able to track your students’ reading and make sure that they are getting their books, we highly recommend that you add all of your students to the Reading List. Students with Individual Memberships can also subscribe to public Reading Lists themselves, but then you won’t be able to see what books they are accessing, and when.

Q: Will there be more Reading Lists to which I can subscribe and assign to my students?

A: Yes! Bookshare is actively working on adding more Reading Lists. We hope that you will like these new additions that make it easier to discover books and get them to your students. Keep checking www.bookshare.org/cms/browse for new lists!
